Mission Grants Report

A total amount of \$18,500 in Mites for LWML MN North grants was available this past quarter. The Board of Directors approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$4,000 for Orphan Grain Train; \$3,000 for C.R.O.S.S. Appeal; \$1,000 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination; \$500 for Lutheran Island Camp, Summer Camp Program Updates; \$3,000 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students; \$2,000 for Swaddling Clothes; \$1,000 for "Main Street Living North" Ministry Outreach TV Program; \$1,000 for DOXOLOGY Pastoral Care and Well-Being; \$1,000 for Project 24, Christ's Care for Children - Kenya; \$1,000 for New Shepherds for South Sudan; \$1,000 for Connecting People in an inclusive Christian Housing Community. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2022-2024 biennium.

Prayer IS Human Care

As I read the fall 2022 issue of the Lutheran Woman's Quarterly with its focus on prayer, I felt the need to reassure each of you that praying with and for one another IS human care. Pastor Stockman's article in the September 2022 Minnesota North Supplement to the Lutheran Witness reinforced the need for us to be content where God places us.

If where He has placed us is in a hospital or another facility or at home caring for someone, we need to remember that God put us this place at this time. Pastor Stockman said it like this. "There are many people whom God has called to stay where they are. Jesus did call the apostles to take the Gospel to the ends of the earth, but not everyone who heard it was called to far off places. The unsung heroes, whom we so rarely hear about, are those who stayed in Corinth, Galatia, Rome, Thessalonica, Ephesus, Philippi, and elsewhere and built up the churches and lived as God's people in those places." Praying is one of those things we do as God's people.

If our situation keeps us from doing many of the things that we think we should be doing, prayer, praise, thanksgiving, and supplication CAN be done. Many or most of us know that we can pray more or better. I was particularly intrigued by the second part of ideas stimulated by the quarterly such as the Beyond Bible Coloring article on page 7 by Alli Bauck. She talks about Visual Faith Ministry (VFM) (visualfaithmin.org) of which she is a part of the Family Life Coaches team. The website says, "Visual prayer takes place at the kitchen counter, at your desk, or while traveling - it is possible anytime and anywhere you pray. A visual prayer might be as simple as a written-out prayer or prayer requests. It also may include designs, "doodling", and color added during a

time of conversation with God. In this way, visual prayer is both a process – of writing. doodling, and coloring as you pray, and the result is a product, or a picture of time spent with God." It could be something that you purchase, like the picture below so you could pray intentionally in each of these areas as you color. It can be your doodles around a particular word theme for your prayers or a blank notecard with categories for themes or sectioned by the people you want to remember in your prayers. Notes can be added as ideas or people pop into your head during your busy time so that you remember when you have quieter time to reflect on them. Just the card is a reminder to put prayer in your schedule. If you fasten your cards together when they are full, you have a history or "picture of your time spent with God."

Human Care is more than giving or making things or physically doing something for others. It is also about prayer. Visual praying could help us be content in the spot God puts us by letting us "see" what we are doing. We see a card or other visual waiting for us to slow down and pray and it helps us include a variety in our prayers including praise, thanksgiving and supplications. God will bless your prayers.

One of the Leader/Member Development Goals is to help women discover the Spiritual Gift(s) the Holy Spirit provides to do His work. Spiritual gifts are our special abilities, not necessarily our talents and abilities, although God can use them in the Spiritual gifts the Spirit gives to be used for the purpose of building up the body of Christ and extending His mission on earth. Spiritual gifts change as we grow in understanding our faith and become more mature Christians and as the Spirit leads us in new ministries and tasks. Why should we know about Spiritual gifts? In 1 Corinthians 12:1, Paul tells us not to be "ignorant" or "misunderstand" the gifts. He has already designed the work we are to do as we read in Ephesians. 2:10, "We are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

We probably all have experienced at some time or another, if we are honest, that serving isn't always with gladness (our motto). How do we get to serving with gladness?

Have you ever asked yourself these questions?

- How do I fit into this congregation?
- What can I/should I do?
- Do you ever just jump in and later think to yourself, "Maybe this isn't what I should be doing?"
- What makes you say "yes" when someone asks you to do something and then realize maybe this wasn't the role God gifted to you?
- How many times do you find yourself saying "yes" because you feel obligated--because someone must do it?
- Do you ever find yourself saying "no" because you are fearful?

If we know our good gifts, the ones the Spirit

gives us to do the work He has chosen for us, it can help to answer these questions and make serving a joy.

The Leadership Development Committee has designed a Spiritual Gifts Discovery Workshop to help women learn more about Spiritual gifts. The workshop will:

- Give an awareness and understanding of the spiritual gifts;
- · Help understand why the Spirit gives gifts;
- Know the purpose(s) of spiritual gifts and;
- Provide tools to help women discover the Spiritual gifts God might be giving them

Greetings!

As a newly elected regional vice president and assigned to the Scholarship Committee, I felt that I needed to learn more about each of this year's scholarship recipients. I was very inspired by their applications. Each recipient submitted a 400-500-word essay about themselves and the activities that have inspired their vocational choices. I thought I'd share a brief portion of each of the applicants' responses to the first essay question, "Who is Jesus?" thinking that you may be encouraged by them, as am I.

Jacob Franck, a first-year student at Concordia University, Chicago, Illinois majoring in Theological Languages and minoring in Philosophy while also in the army, confesses that "nothing else matters except the fact that Jesus died for you."

Mark Langton, a first-year student at Concordia Theological Seminary at Fort Wayne, Indiana studying towards a Master of Divinity degree answers the question quoting the Apostle Peter with "Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God."

Jacob Lemke, a second-year student at Concordia University, Mequon, Wisconsin, studying Theological Languages, confesses that "Jesus is my Lord and Savior and friend who has died on the cross for the remission of all sins and redemption of all mankind."

Bruce Maul applied for a scholarship as first-year student at Concordia Seminary, St Louis, Missouri in the Specific Ministry program. He wrote that "Jesus is the God-Man who lived a sinless life, was the perfect Lamb of God, took my sins away with Him to the cross, and gave up His life so I may live in eternity with our Heavenly Father." (Please note that Bruce Maul has recently resigned from the Specific Ministry program.)

The students have a long, hard road ahead of them. We pray that all will have a blessed year, learning to apply the Law and Gospel.
