

The May 15, 2022, deadline for LWML MN North District scholarship applications if fast approaching. If you are attending or plan on attending one of our LCMS Concordia Universities or Seminaries to pursue full time church work, you should apply for a scholarship. We offer Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination and Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students. Full time church work includes deaconesses, Lutheran day school classroom teachers and Directors of Christian Education – just to name a few. Please check out the website at: *www.lwmlmnn.org* under the Resources menu for all the details.

In 1964, the scholarship grant was started with several different names, but Scholarships for Church Workers and Men Preparing for Ordination was the most popular. That first grant started at \$3,000. To date through the 2020-2021 year, we will have given a total of \$1,090,000 to Church Work students and Men Preparing for Ordination. We always appreciate letters from former scholarship recipients of where they are now and what they are doing. During my time with the Scholarships Committee, I have had several women come and say they received an LWML MN North District Church Workers Scholarship.

For students entering church work vocations, it is important to understand the motive behind the LWML's acts of love—it is more than just being thoughtful and caring. LWML offers scholarship grants to those seeking careers in service to our Lord because of the League Pledge. "We consecrate to our Savior our hands to work for Him, our feet to go on His errands, our voice to sing His praises, our lips to proclaim His redeeming love, our silver and our gold to extend His kingdom, our will to do His will, and every power of our life to the great task of bringing the lost and erring into eternal fellowship with Him."

We do this all for HIM. To God alone be the glory. Share God's love as you "Serve the Lord with Gladness" (Psalm 100.2).

Once again, I was impressed and encouraged by the results of the Christian Life reports, In the midst of all the shutdowns, you still found ways to nurture Christian Life and Growth. Here are some of the statistics:

- Seventy-four groups continue to participate in Bible studies, 55 help with the cost of members attending LWML events, 68 provide car pooling, 78 announce all events in church communications and extend personal invitations to LWML meetings, and 30 provide welcome gifts to new members.
- Fifty-five groups participate in a prayer chain, 34 make the Mite calendar available and promote Mite collections & prayers, and 40 encourage and thank Sunday school teachers and VBS volunteers.
- Sixty groups visit people in nursing homes and the homebound praying with them and holding devotions; and 26 hold a community event providing food and Christian entertainment.

MISSION GRANTS REPORT

A total amount of \$25,000 in mites for LWML MN North District grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended, and the BOD approved, the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$2,000 for Orphan Grain Train, \$1,800 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students, \$2,000 for Doxology Pastoral Care and Well-being, and \$4,500 for LSF Haiti - Jacmel Lutheran Home & Center of Refuge Orphanage. All of the Mission Grants have been paid in full for the 2020-2022 biennium!

2020-2022 BIENNIUM MITE OVERAGE

Mites we collected through March 31, 2022, for the 2020-2022 biennium exceeded our goal of \$140,500 by **\$6,356.49**!



As per the Bylaws of the LWML Minnesota North District, Article XVI, Section 4: "If the district mite goal

is exceeded, the LWML MN North District Board of Directors has the authority and responsibility to disburse the funds to projects related to missions." The LWML MN North District Board of Directors met on April 19, 2022, and voted to send the full overage amount of \$6,356.49, to be divided among the recipients for both the Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination and Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students.

Leadership 101

The road of Life is a road to service. Most accept the servanthood role of life with joy. Being human, however, we may experience times of resentment. For the example of the perfect servant, we look to our Lord Jesus. "Who being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be grasped, but made himself nothing, taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself and became obedient to death – even death on a cross!" (Phil. 2:6-8)

The road of life is a road of leadership. Fewer people would accept that statement. For many people the word "leadership" has the frightening implication of responsibility.

Servants and Leaders For the Christian, the progression from servanthood to leadership can be a natural, joyous one. It is often difficult to discover where one ends and the other begins. Both servants and leaders:

- *Have varying personalities and abilities...God offers us the same amount of grace but has given different talents and gifts.
- *Are followers of the Savior.
- *Show love and concern for people,
- *Receive personal rewards for their service...Let us not grow weary in doing good, for at the proper time we shall reap a harvest if we do not give up (Gal. 66:9).
- *Servanthood is all-inclusive it involves the sum total of our living. *Never be lacking in zeal, but keep your spiritual fervor, serving the Lord* (Rom. 12:11).

Leadership is but one aspect of this total commitment. To lead is to guide on a way, or a position at the front. Leadership is a noun describing one who leads. A Christian leader is first and foremost a follower of the Savior, which should be apparent in all concepts and actions.

Leaders are both born and made. While their Maker may endow some with good leadership skills, Christian leaders can be developed.

Why are people afraid of it? Some do not want the responsibility of decisionmaking. Others don't fully understand what a leadership position entails. There are many other personal reasons. There are both formal and informal leaders...those appointed and elected, whether or not best qualified, that person is perceived to be the leader, and consequently is given special statue and authority. There are times when various group members perform leadership functions. In this role, they are called "informal" leaders. Leadership is not solely a matter of personal traits. Leadership can be a function of the situation.

A good Christian leader is determined as much by the situation as by personal attributes or group requirements. This person loves the Lord, loves His work, loves people, and is willing to learn.

Give prayer and thought to how God might use you as a leader as positions in the LWML Minnesota North District are available.

Mission Grant Proposals 2022 - 2024 Biennium

The following Mission Grant proposals have met the criteria of the LWML MN North District Bylaws and were selected by the Mission Grants Committee to appear on the ballot.

Submitted by the Mission Grants Committee: Glenice Hall (Chairman), Sandra Bakeberg, Joan Johnson, Carol Ann Sander, Rev. Bruce Timm, Pastoral Counselor

Grant A – Swaddling Clothes (\$10,000) "Swaddling Clothes" is an LCMS program designed to meet the needs of young women needing support in their pregnancies and motherhood by supplying them with items that are basic necessities, including formula, diapers, baby clothes, etc. Redeemer Lutheran Church in Aurora, Minnesota is the only LCMS congregation in Minnesota that offers this service ("Swaddling Clothes"). Distribution of items is done on a monthly basis and members of the congregation are able to show God's love to families in need through this caring ministry.

Grant B - Bringing Spanish Braille Bibles to Central and South America (\$15,000)

Lutheran Braille Workers has received a request to produce over 20,000 volumes of Spanish Braille Bibles for Bible societies and churches throughout Central and South America within the next two years. This grant would provide financial assistance to cover 3,000 Spanish Bible Braille volumes for free distribution to those in need in Latin American Countries.

Grant C – C.R.O.S.S. Appeal (\$18,000)

Funding for this grant would enable the eight LCMS schools that are currently operating in the Minnesota North District to meet costs that are not in their current budget. These costs may be in technology, improved programming, or in providing financial assistance to students who desire to receive their education in these settings, but may find it difficult to afford the tuition. This grant would provide financial assistance to the C.R.O.S.S. Appeal. **Grant D - Short-Term Mission Team Leader Training - MOST Ministries (\$6,000)** MOST Ministries, an LCMS Recognized Service Organization, recruits and sends short-term mission teams in response to requests from missionaries and national churches around the world. Each team must have a trained, competent leader. Team Leader Training involves an orientation, a two-day retreat, as well as two or more mission trips with an experienced leader. This grant would provide funds to defray the costs of the training for new Team Leader Trainees.

Grant E - French Bibles & Catechisms for

Haiti (\$10,000) The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti is an altar and pulpit fellowship with the LCMS. French Bibles and Catechisms are not easily available to the families in Haiti. This grant would provide funds for the purchase of Bibles for the fourth graders, and Catechisms for older children in the schools in the North District of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Haiti.

Grant F - New Shepherds for South Sudan (**\$7,500**) The Evangelical Lutheran Church in Sudan - South Sudan has more than 200 congregations, but fewer than 80 pastors to serve them and share the word of God. The Concordia Lutheran Institute for the Holy Ministry was established to train men to be faithful pastors. This grant would help adopt two South Sudan seminarians, providing their tuition, room, board, and supplies for a full year of study.

Grant G – "Main Street Living North" Ministry Outreach TV Program (\$10,000)

"Main Street Living North" is designed to meet the needs of people who are home bound, in assisted-living and nursing homes, as well as to those without a church to attend on a Sunday morning. This program is produced in Fargo, North Dakota, and the funding received would allow for another twenty weeks of continued broadcasting. Through this ministry the message of Christ can be taken to viewers throughout Minnesota, North Dakota, and into Canada.

Grant H – Scholarships for Full-Time Church

Work Students (\$32,000) Rising costs of obtaining an education through the Concordia University system may discourage or prevent potential students from enrolling. This grant would provide financial assistance to students eager to serve the Lord through full-time work in our churches and schools. Scholarships for these students have been offered since 1964; these former students now serve in many varied ways throughout our synod.

Grant I - Kruse Memorial Chapel Transformation (\$4,000) The healing

ministries of Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch create an eternal, life-giving impact in the lives of children who have faced unimaginable abuse, neglect, and trauma. The highly-attended, weekly interactive Chapel experiences at the Kruse Memorial Chapel in Minot offer the healing care of the Gospel. This grant would provide funds to be used for upgrades in the Kruse Memorial Chapel on the Minot campus.

Grant J – Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination (\$8,000) Jesus set in motion the Great Commission to proclaim His Gospel, but without workers, many are unable to hear the saving Gospel message. Through this grant, men at either of our seminaries will receive equal funding to help offset the expenses for their tuition. This enables these students to have less financial stress and to be able to focus on their studies without worrying about financial burdens. **Grant K – Project 24, Christ's Care for Children – Kenya (\$10,800)** This project has been in operation for over ten years and serves the spiritual and physical needs for vulnerable children in Kenya by providing secure boarding facilities. To date, this project is providing support for 190 children, but as additional funds are received, more children can be nurtured in these Christian settings. This grant would provide child sponsorship funds for at least ten children, who are in need of education, medical care, and/or life skills training.

Grant L – Lutheran Island Camp Summer Camp Program Updates (\$10,000) Campers come to this camp for horseback riding, fishing, and fun, and leave with Jesus in their hearts. This grant will provide funding to update and upgrade the programmatic elements at Lutheran Island Camp in order to ensure the continued ability to provide high quality programs to the people being served.

Grant M – Orphan Grain Train (\$10,000)

Throughout the world many are in need of food, clothing, water, medical supplies and equipment, and Scripture-based literature. Orphan Grain Train seeks to meet these needs by providing transportation for these items to show God's love and service to individuals throughout the world. Funding for this project will facilitate the shipping costs of donated relief supplies.

Grant N – DOXOLOGY Pastoral Care and Well-being (\$15,000) DOXOLOGY is designed to meet the needs of pastors by equipping and revitalizing them to serve their congregations with renewed vigor as a result of this training. Issues that are addressed through this training focus on the core of pastoral effectiveness and congregational life, and enable pastors, their spouses, and lay leaders to work together in ensuring positive results for their congregations. This grant would enable pastors to offset the tuition costs, which many small or financially struggling congregations may be unable to afford.

2022 CONVENTION MISSION GRANT PROPOSALS (Cont'd)

Grant O - Promoting an Inclusive Christian Housing Community of Faith (\$15,000) AbleLight will be opening the doors at Cornerstone Village in Oakdale, Minnesota in late summer 2023 to provide inclusive and innovative housing for independent adults with disabilities, adults at risk of homelessness, and limited income adults and families. Opportunities will be created to bring residents and community members together to experience fun, faith, education, and fellowship with a spirit of community through activities such as Bible studies, book clubs, employment supports, money management education, and health and wellness programming. This grant would provide funds to aid AbleLight in providing social, faith-based self-improvement programming and supports at Cornerstone Village in Oakdale, Minnesota.
