

LWML National Convention



The Lutheran Women's Missionary League welcomed over 3,500 people to the 40th biennial convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, June 22–25, 2023, under the theme "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations" based on Psalm 33:12-13.

The voting body adopted a \$2,350,000 mission goal for the 2023–2025 biennium. This goal, by the grace of God, will fund 31 mission grants, as women and men respond in prayer and mite offerings during the next two years. LWML Minnesota North District contributes \$0.25 of every dollar collected to this mission goal. There were over 100 participants (see photo) attending from LWML Minnesota North District! The MNN District banner was carried by President Kathy Brandt accompanied by the young women reps for our district, Shawna Kohls and Rachel Franck (page 3). At the convention the ladies were busy with various activities with the other YWRs. In addition, the young women were also present at all the convention sessions and sat with the MNN District delegation. A highlight of the convention was their participation in the district banner procession and the procession of the flags of 83 nations where the LWML has participated in missions.

Two buses of participants made the trip and stopped at Mequon College and Ellsworth Creamery on the return trip.

Firmly Planted




This group in California and all of ours in MN North has two goals – mercy and spreading the Gospel of Jesus Christ, crucified for our sins.

The mission statement of the CA group states, "Stitchin' for Missions exists to assist people in need throughout the world by sharing the love of Christ Jesus through the gift of a quilt." They have a requirement as the gifts go out into the world. "The gifts must go out with the Gospel message—proclaiming the love of Christ as God's Son and our Savior. Most of the time the proclamation is achieved by those who help us distribute the gifts."

Our lists of where our gifts go is similar: Orphan Grain Train, Lutheran Schools, Lutheran Island Camp, delivered by our Pastors and other Christian Organizations. What about those that policemen and firemen, etc. deliver? How do you proclaim the Gospel to those recipients? The CA group attaches a label with the words of John 3:16 on it as a declaration of God's love. Remember it is our job to plant the seed. God provides the growth of faith.

Keep up the good work in Minnesota North District! Keep on stitching or visiting or praying and serving with gladness. Remember that your gift in their need is an opportunity that God gives you to speak of Jesus' love!

Scholarships

May 15, the deadline for the 2023-2024 school year, has come and gone. The Lord has blessed us with three applicants for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination and five applications for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Worker Students this year.

The Scholarship Committee met on June 3, 2023, to review applicants and prepare recommendations for the Minnesota North District LWML Board of Directors. Members of the Scholarship Committee are Teresa Klatt, Valerie Johnson, Connie Groen, and Rev. Matthew Vrudny. Minnesota North District LWML President, Kathy Brandt attended the meeting by phone. The Board of Directors will review the Committee's recommendations at their next meeting this coming July.

Each applicant must be preparing for full-time church work in the LCMS, be a resident of the MN North District and a member of a Missouri Synod congregation, and be enrolled in an LCMS affiliated university or seminary. Each applicant needs a written reference from their pastor and two others. Each needs to submit an essay answering the questions, "Who is Jesus and how does He still come and care for you?" and "How do you think the LWML scholarship opportunity will continue in your life and career choices?"

LCMS seminaries are Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, IN and Concordia Seminary, St. Louis, MO.

LCMS universities are: Concordia University Ann Arbor,MI; Concordia University Irvine, CA; Concordia University Wisconsin, WI; Concordia University Chicago, IL; Concordia University St. Paul, MN; and Concordia University Seward, NE. Below are a few statistics from this year's applicants.

Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination:

- All are planning to attend Concordia
 Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana.
- All intend to receive a Master of Divinity Degree.
- Two have received an LWML scholarship in the past.

Scholarships for Full-Time Church Worker Students:

- Three plan to attend Concordia, St Paul.
- Two plan to attend Concordia, Nebraska.
- Four have not received a scholarship from LWML in the past.
- Four have at least one LCMS church worker parent.
- · One is male.

The final decisions for the scholarships will be made by the MN North District LWML Board of Directors. We cannot accept any more applicants for the 2023-2024 school year. If you'd like to apply for a 2024-2025 school year scholarship, you can submit your application and supporting documentation by May 15, 2024. Structure

Summer Greetings! After recently attending the national LWML Convention and Structure Workshop, I thought I'd share some tips on bylaws and provide you with some resources you can use in your Zones and Groups!

What are Bylaws?

The bylaws are the basic rules relating to itself as an organization. It states rules that the organization considers important. Rules that:

- Cannot be changed without prior notice to the members.
- Require the vote of a specified large majority (usually two-thirds).
- · Cannot be suspended.

Because they are intentionally difficult to change, the bylaws should include only the basic rules on how the organization functions.

Constructing Bylaws

When constructing bylaws, they must have these five articles:

- Name (what you are calling yourself)
- Object (Why does this organization exist)
- Officers (name of the officers within the organization)
- Parliamentary Authority (Roberts Rules of Order Newly Revised)
- Amendments

Standing Rules

These are rules that:

- Are related to the details of the operations of the organization.
- Can be adopted or changed at the discretion of the organization.
- Are adopted by majority vote when the need arises.

Standing rules should be printed under a separate heading following the bylaws. These rules can be removed and amended by the same voting body that adopted them at any meeting.

Keynote Speaker Announced



The LWML Minnesota North District is excited to announce that Katie Schuermann will be our keynote speaker for our 2024 District convention, June 3-5, 2024 at Cragun's Resort near Brainerd, MN. She will be speaking on Tuesday, June 4 on the topic "Light in the Lord". Make plans to attend the convention. More details will follow.

Author Katie Schuermann lives in central Illinois with her husband of 20+ years, the Rev. Michael Schuermann. She began her writing career in Mrs. Kaufman's fourth grade elementary class, self-publishing poetry in a treasured yellow, teal, and hot-pink spiral-bound notebook. She has since upgraded her trusty notebook to a Mac on which she pounds out articles for publications such as *The Lutheran Witness* and *The Federalist*.

Schuermann's nonfiction books, *He Remembers the Barren* (LL 2011; 2nd ed, EP, 2017), *Pew Sisters* (CPH 2013), and *He Restores My Soul* (EP, 2018), address the topics of suffering and the theology of the cross for the benefit of her sisters in Christ. Her acclaimed Anthems of Zion fiction books, including *House of Living Stones* (CPH, 2014), *The Choir Immortal* (CPH, 2015), and

The Harvest Raise (CPH, 2017), tell the story of Emily Duke, a choir director from the big city who moves to a small town in Illinois to direct the local church choir.

Schuermann was given an Award of Merit from the Associated Church Press for her journalistic work on the feature article, "A Light in the Darkness," in the September/October 2013 issue of Lutherans Engage the World, and her debut novel, House of Living Stones, was a 2015 Christy Award finalist under the category of First Novel. Most recently, her hymn text, "Open Wide the Chapel Doors," was chosen as the winner of the 175th Anniversary hymn competition of Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana.

Mission Grants Report

A total amount of \$18,000 in mites for LWML MN North grants was available this past quarter. The Board of Directors approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$2,000 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination; \$11,000 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students; \$3,000 for Swaddling Clothes; \$2,000 for "Main Street Living North" Ministry Outreach TV Program. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2022-2024 biennium.

Leader Development

At the Milwaukee LWML Convention, I was privileged to attend a breakout session led by Brianna Stahlecker, Chairman of the Leader Development Committee.

We previewed the new resource, Lutheran Women in Mission FOCUS on Jesus, a series of presentations that gives a new look at who we are as Lutheran Women in Mission based on the mission statement of the LWML. This information can be shared with a woman new to the congregation, a woman in the congregation unfamiliar with Lutheran Women in Mission, or as a refresher at local, zone, or district events.

A series of five presentations consists of:

- The first presentation, "Facts" about "Who We Are" as Women in Mission, can be used in a variety of situations and at any level to introduce the organization.
- The second provides information about preparing and equipping women for mission service.
- The third covers how Lutheran Women in Mission proclaim Christ and answers the question "Why We Go!" It is always Christ Centered.
- The fourth presentation proclaims a unified message that Christ is near and far and provides an overview on how Lutheran Women in Mission support missions.
- The last presentation in this series looks at how Lutheran Women in Mission serves others.



After watching each presentation at this breakout session, participants discussed ways of using them. We agreed that they could be used to introduce LWML to those who do not know about it, or as a refresher for all of us. The presentations could be used at zone or district functions, on social media, or in newsletters.

Young Women

Matthew 7: 28-29 "And when Jesus finished these sayings the crowds were astonished at His teaching for, He was teaching them as one who had authority,"

Christ has authority over satanic power. Jesus gave His disciples spiritual authority. He gave them the power over unclean spirits and to heal one's illnesses. We, too, as God's people cannot allow Satan to rob, deceive, and steal from us, for we have this authority over Satan. Jesus confers to His people His authority over Satan. He wants our heart to be completely attuned to Him.

God's grace has enlarged our hearts. Therefore, we want to show tenderness towards others, as God shows His tenderness to us. He daily forgives all our sins. We fully rest in His grace as we remember His faithfulness, as we perform the acts of love to others, and do the works He has prepared ahead of time for us to do. We study God's Word as we are being educated by God Himself. As we face storms of trouble, we no longer accept Satan's lies.

As I see turmoil, sickness, guilt, etc. stare me in the face, my heart is at rest, because I know ALL things are in God's hands. He is working everything for good. In contrast, no more, "Where is God and why would He allow this to happen?" No more living in fear and chaos. The righteousness of faith (God's authority given us) frightens Satan and drives him away. It's the full assurance of the reliability of God's Word. The result will be peace and that assurance forever. Observing dos and don'ts are not the basis of God's righteousness. Righteousness is believing God's truth and living by this truth.

What about God's authority given to each of us when Satan attacks? Believe in the absolute power of Jesus' blood and His forgiveness for you.
