Jesus was born to die: "this Jesus, delivered up according to the definite plan and foreknowledge of God, you crucified and killed by the hands of lawless men. God raised him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it" (Acts 2:23-24). By the death of Jesus our sins were removed. The cross is the fulfillment of the promise of God spoken to Adam and Eve of the One who would once and for all release mankind from Satan's grasp. Whereas there once was only death, God would bring life anew through the resurrection of His Son.

"And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins" (1 Cor. 15:17). Christ lives, our sins are forgiven, and through Him we also live. St. Paul reminds us that being baptized into Christ's death, we have also been baptized into his resurrection, "so that we too might walk in newness of life" (Rom. 6:3-4). No longer held by sin or death, we are free to live fully and wholly in Christ, serving God and one another. Christ is risen! Alleluia!
