


Counselor's corner

"Therefore, it is our intent to give witness before God and all Christendom ... that the explanation here set forth ... is our teaching, faith, and confession. In it we shall appear before the judgment throne of Jesus Christ, by God's grace, with fearless hearts and thus give account of our faith..." ("The Solid Declaration of the Formula of Concord," XII, 40).



As Dr. Luther nailed his 95 Thesis to the church door in Wittenberg, he probably wasn't thinking of the furor that would result. The uproar came later as those who had badly maligned Scripture came into the light of the Truth. We celebrate the Reformation as that day when Luther stepped into the public square to proclaim the Gospel of Christ. But we must not forget that Luther also stood before the King and Pope, ordered to deny what he had written and said — or face death. With unchecked courage he spoke, *"I cannot and will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand, I can do no other; so help me God."*

We are called to give witness to our teaching, faith and confession in a world in which controversy about the Word of



God is prevalent. To Peter's confession of faith, Jesus said *"... I will build my church, and the gates of hell shall not prevail against it"* (Matt. 16:18). We stand on the rock-like confession of Christ as the Son of God and we, with the Reformers, *"can do no other, so help [us] God"* (Martin Luther speech, April 18, 1521, at the Diet of Worms, Germany).
