
Gifts from the Heart: Ingathering

Lakes Area Pregnancy Center is a volunteer organization providing alternatives to abortion and committed to sharing the message of Jesus Christ to women and men facing unplanned pregnancy situations. Thousands of items were collected, including baby quilts, baby clothes, diapers, sweaters, a stroller and a baby walker.

Bethany Good Samaritan Society–Brainerd ministers to the elderly and those needing special care or can't live alone. Over 150 puzzles and books were donated, as well as 250 pairs of socks, 130 lap robes, quilts and afghans.

Fifty phone cards were collected and will be donated to the LCMS seminary students.




Society or Zone event idea
