LWML MN North District

The application deadline for scholarships is still in the future, but it is not too early to begin encouraging those who will be attending LCMS universities and seminaries to be aware of the process.

Scholarships through the LWML Minnesota North District are available to members of LCMS congregations within the District attending or planning to attend one of the LMCS Concordia's or one of the two seminaries in preparation for full-time church work. The eligible universities include:

- Concordia University, Ann Arbor;
- · Concordia University, Irvine;
- · Concordia University Wisconsin;
- · Concordia University, Chicago;
- · Concordia University, St. Paul;
- and Concordia University, Nebraska.

The eligible seminaries are; Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne.

Full-time church work includes Deaconess. Church school teacher. Director of Christian Education, Director of Christian Outreach, Director of Parish Music, Director of Family Life Ministry, and much more. The office of pastor is also included, of course.



The deadline for scholarship applications is May 15, 2026. Eligible students are encouraged to visit the LWML MN North District website for specific information and are encouraged to start the process early. Information can be found at *lwmlmnn.org*. Click on the scholarship link on the committee menu for scholarship information. Seminary students should also be aware of potential scholarships available through the LCMS Minnesota North District.

Additionally, each university within Synod has a very limited number of grants available for students. Interested students should contact the university that they will be attending for more information.

SETAPART 10 SERVE



The Synod's emphasis on recruitment of pastors, "Set Apart to Serve." suggests that young men be encouraged to enter the ministry of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. Congregational member support and encouragement at a young age is a factor in many men entering the seminary.

More information regarding "Set Apart to Serve" is to be found at *lcms.org/set-apart-to*serve. An emphasis on recruitment of young men for the office of pastor from the Minnesota North District should be every congregation's goal.

The Scholarship Committee will be seeking increased funding for seminarians as part of the mission grant process voted at the upcoming 2026 convention.

Scholarship grants, as are all LWML MN North District's mission programs, are supported through MITES.

A total amount of \$24,983 in Mites for LWML MN North grants was available this past quarter. STEP 3: Note: In certain circumstances it maybe necessary to obtain approval from the group submitting the proposal before

STEP 4: Sending Mission Grant Proposal Information


