





And the Lord Added Daily...Acts 2:47

(This is the third in a series of articles to introduce you to the mission speakers at our convention in June.)

I am so pleased to join in at this year's convention. For the past few years the convention has fallen on the same week I have been in school or have had a youth servant event on the reservation, so I have missed the convention. This year things have worked out for me, so I can attend.

Even when I was a child, I felt pulled toward a career in the church but life seemed to pull me in other directions. I married and had two children, but the marriage ended in divorce. I worked full-time for the telephone company for 16 years and during that time met my present husband Bob. I began to fill more and more of my time volunteering in the church and craving more and more Bible Studies. So there I was, in my 40's, and God reached out one more time to help me understand that all of my experiences could be used for the growth of His kingdom.

There I was at Concordia College, St. Paul, one of the oldest students in most of my classes but one of the most enthusiastic. I did an internship at my church in River Falls, Wisconsin and graduated from Concordia University St.Paul in 1996 with a degree in evangelism. My first position was with Minnesota North working in East Grand Forks after the floods. I spent a wonderful nine months with them learning from them and working to help put lives and churches back together.

My internship and the experience in East Grand Forks led me to my present call as the missionary to the Ojibwe people of the Fond du Lac reservation. We moved to Cloquet, Minnesota, which is the community bordering the reservation. After almost 10 years I continue to struggle to learn their language and culture in order to better serve the people and help guide them as they learn about God's great love for them. To this end, I have taken classes at the tribal college in Cloquet and am working on my Masters Degree in Christian Outreach from Concordia University. Mission Grant Proposals for 2006-2008

Within the District

A. Scholarships for Seminary Students -\$11,000

This project will encourage men who have been called by God to be pastors by helping to defray their educational and living costs while attending the seminary.

B. Scholarships for Full-time Church Work Students - \$55,000

These scholarships are for students who are being trained for full-time church work at the universities and seminaries of the LCMS. Scholarships will be awarded on the basis of financial need and academic standing and college or seminary acceptance.

C. Shepherd of the Lake Lutheran Church, Two Harbors, MN - \$10,000

Shepherd of the Lake, a new mission congregation in Two Harbors, is seeking funding to continue its ministry to children and young families. Funding will help with educational and support materials to foster the spread the Gospel.

D. Nebraska Youth Teaching VBS on the White Earth Reservation - \$3,000

Since 1997 Nebraska youth have been involved with outreach ministries to the children and youth of the White Earth Reservation. This grant will provide funds for transportation, food, housing and teaching materials for this VBS outreach on the reservation.

E. Jumping for Joy Ministry, Fergus Falls, MN area - \$8,000

Christ instructed us to bring the little children to Him...for of such is the Kingdom of God. Jumping for Joy Ministry reaches out to eleven childcare provider homes monthly with Christian-based lessons through age-appropriate activities. More than 100 children in the area are reached with the Gospel message through this ministry.

F. Lutheran Island Camp, Financial Support for Staff Training -\$10,000

This grant will assist in training the LIC staff to facilitate a Christian life style

through the development of daily habits of love, fellowship, Christian care and ethical leadership. This enables staff to be encouraged and share their faith, minister to campers of all ages, and continue in God's service as He guides them in their vocational choices.

G. Steps of Faith Daycare, Faith Lutheran Church, Silver Bay, MN - \$3,000

Focusing on care and education of children, Steps of Faith Daycare assists in developing communication and partnerships with families in a loving, caring, and enriching Christian environment. This allows them to share Jesus with children as well as care for their minds and bodies.

Outside The District

H. Outreach to the Muslims - \$6,000

One out of every six people on God's earth is a Muslim. Despite death threats to himself and his family, Hicham, a converted Muslim with a heart to share the Gospel, is attending Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, Indiana preparing to be an LCMS pastor. This funding will provide support for this new Christian as he and his family are nurtured with the love of Christ, and others who are reached through his witness.

I. Partners In Mission - \$5,000

This grant will help sponsor the mission and ministry to the children of the inter-city of Minneapolis and St. Paul where 100,000 of the 300,000 Hmong people that live in the United States reside. Partners In Mission Ministry helps the Phillips Neighborhood by supplying materials, Bibles, and invitational handouts. It financially supports the ethnic leaders, with training, organizing, and teaching English as a second language, enabling them to share Jesus and bring them into the family of faith.

J. Trinity/Hope – Feed the Hungry Children in Haiti - \$4,750

Providing one hot meal per day for the children in Lutheran schools in Haiti is a powerful witness used by the Holy Spirit to discredit the Voodoo teaching that God is unapproachable and non-responsive to Haitians. This project will help feed an average

school of 125 children each day so they can be fed both bodily and spiritually.

K. Orphan Grain Train Transportation Costs - \$7,000

This grant would provide monies to transport food, water, clothing, medical supplies and equipment, and scripture-based literature for the spiritual and physical needs of His beloved people worldwide.

L. Generator for Cap-Haitian, Haiti's First Evangelical Lutheran Church - \$10,000

A reliable electrical power source is needed to provide a firm infrastructure to power the church, schools, medical clinic, women's center and the safe water. This grant will help to accomplish this by funding the purchase of an diesel generator system in Cap-Haitian, Haiti's First Evangelical Lutheran Church and North District Complex.

M. Open Gate Christian Fellowship Assistance in Cambodia - \$4,000

Open Gate Christian Fellowship, with an aggressively growing membership of over 3,000 people, is preparing to develop future leader institutions among the Christian church in Cambodia. This grant would be used for further training of their own leaders in the expansion of God's Kingdom, and organize seminars for teaching of pastors, lay evangelists, Sunday School teachers, women's group leaders and youth for future professional work in the fellowship.

N. Swahili Outreach Ministry - \$7,000

The Swahili Outreach is one of seven new LCMS immigrant ministries that have started in Minnesota. With no Christian church for the 5,000 Swahili speaking people in the Twin Cities area, a local fellowship of 500 Swahili speaking people have organized and invited a vicar to serve them. This grant would help support this outreach.

O. School Expansion in Bangladesh - \$8,500

Bangladesh, with a population consisting of 88% Muslims and 10% Hindu, and also one of the poorest countries in the world needs to hear of the love of Jesus. This grant would accomplish this by purchasing one-half acre of land and building four classrooms that would provide 500 students with a Christian



education and an opportunity to escape from poverty and provide a place for Sunday worship.

P. Kisi Language Project in Liberia, Lutheran Bible Translators - \$9,000

This grant will help to provide funding to translate books of the Old Testament into the Kisi language in support of the Kisi Language Project in Liberia. It would help develop teacher/pastor workshops, produce additional Kisi literature and establish new learning centers for listening to Scripture on tape.

Q. Audiocassette Materials for Blind and Visually Impaired People - \$5,000

This grant would help enable blind and visually impaired children, youth and adults to hear and share the Good News of Jesus. This organization produces nine magazines that are recorded on audiocassette tapes that are distributed throughout the country.

R. Luther's Small Catechism for Rwanda - \$8,000

In partnership with Lutheran Heritage Foundation, this grant would provide the Lutheran Church in Rwanda with manufacturing and distribution assets for the Kinyarwanda edition of Luther's Small Catechism. This simple yet powerful tool for teaching God's Word, will assist in training teachers and leaders responsible for reaching out with the Gospel to the people in Rwanda.

S. Transportation of VBS Teams into Ontario - \$5,000

The LAMP Transportation of VBS Teams into Ontario grant will enable 16 volunteer short-term missionaries to fly from Sioux Lookout, Ontario, into Bearskin Lake, Big Trout Lake, and Red Sucker Lake,

all remote areas of northern Canada. These teams will teach VBS to First Nations children in the summer; some also will minister to the youth with LAMP Youth Bible study curriculum.


