

We thank God for His bountiful love and blessings! The mite goal of \$136,000 for the 2014-2016 biennium has been exceeded! The overage (after 25% was given to LWML on the national level) is \$7,811.77.

Other things to know...

The BOD, at their April 12 Quarterly meeting, voted to send the +\$7,000 to our two LCMS seminaries—in St. Louis, MO and Fort Wayne, IN. Because we all benefit from the theological training of our pastors, we felt it was a good avenue for our extra mites.

A significant portion of this overage is due to an annual gift from the interest on an Endowment Fund set up by Our Savior's Lutheran Church, St. Cloud, MN, before it closed. The money has been accumulating in the LWML MNN Bank Account; the BOD earlier in the biennium decided to put it towards the mite goal.

Your gracious and generous giving, plus other avenues, has made this overage possible—with God's guiding hand! All we can say is "Thank you, Lord, for blessing us beyond what we deserve!"

We certainly are Heirs of God's Abundant Love—in so many ways!

Mission Grants in Review

Grant 1 – Scholarships for Full-time Church Work Students \$50,000 Grant 2 – Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination \$15,000

Eph. 4: 11-12 "And He gave some, apostles; and some prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ."

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League assists in this mission work by financial support through scholarships to full-time church work students and men "preparing" for ordination.

In the 2014-2016 biennium \$50,000 was granted to church work students and \$15,000 to men for ordination. Let us continue to keep these people in our prayers as they go forward as His instruments in spreading the Gospel.

Mission Grants Committee Report

A total of \$23,111.77 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$300 for Scholarships for Full-time Church Work Students; \$15,000 for Life in Christ Lutheran Church, Grand Marais, MN. For LWML MN North mites, an excess of \$7,811.77 was given The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2014-2016 biennium.

MAINTAIN an enthusiastic, cooperative, joyful spirit.

KEEP files in good order to be given to your successor.

Mites at Work for Scholarships

The May 15, 2016, deadline for LWML MN North scholarship applications is fast approaching. If you are attending or plan on attending one of our LCMS Concordia Universities or Seminaries to pursue full time church work, you should apply for a

scholarship. We offer Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination and Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students. Full time church work includes deaconesses, Lutheran day school classroom teachers and directors of Christian education – just to name a few. Please check out the website at: www.lwmlmnn.org under the Resources menu for all the details.

Since 1964, the LWML MN North District has sponsored Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students and Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination. Through your mite donations, \$920,000.00 in scholarships have been awarded. I had mentioned in a previous article that it would be interesting to know where some of our scholarship recipients are now.

We have one scholarship recipient on the LWML MN North Board of Directors. Rev.

Donald Klatt received scholarships when he attended Concordia Seminary in Ft. Wayne in 1998-2000 and 2004-2006. Rev. Klatt and his wife, Teresa, live in the parsonage of Trinity Lutheran Church, Fairfield Township, which is one of three churches he serves. He also serves the congregations of Immanuel Lutheran Church, Shible Township, and

Immanuel Lutheran Church,
Holloway. The Klatts have four
children and five grandchildren.
In addition to serving as Lakeland
Region Pastoral Counselor on
the LWML MN North BOD, Rev.
Klatt is the Pastoral Counselor for
the Appleton Zone LWML and
the Circuit Visitor for the LCMS
Appleton Circuit.

2016-2018 Mission Grant Proposals

The following Mission Grant proposals have met the criteria of the LWML MN North District Bylaws and were selected by the Mission Grants Committee to appear on the ballot.

Gloria Dei School and Church Building - \$15,000

Gloria Dei Lutheran Church's school functions in an inadequate rented space with poor lighting and frequent flooding, Because of the poverty of the congregation, they cannot afford to complete the building. Land was purchased, a well drilled and construction begun. A solid foundation has been built and the first floor soon to be completed. With this grant, the second story will be completed and the building will be finished.

Borphan Grain Train - \$9,000
These funds will help cover the cost of shipping clothing, quilts, layettes, school packs, health kits, food and medical supplies through Orphan Grain Train, that many, may see the good works of God in their time of need. That God may use us to provide those works of service for others.

Chapel Furnishings - \$5,000

These requested funds would help purchase a mobile pulpit and chapel chairs for the new chapel on the Fargo campus. This grant would help complete the chapel furnishings so it can be ready for use in 2016. Spiritual Life education and guidance are so crucial to successful treatment of the children that reside at the Ranch. This grant will allow us to continue providing

these services in a much needed and appropriate worship setting.

Families Witnessing to Families - \$10,000 Sharing the Gospel and helping individuals come to know Christ and grow in His Word is what Family Shield Ministries exists to accomplish. Through the outreach ministries and services people come to know Christ and grow in faith as they listen to the radio program aired on 52 stations, participate in educational programs, are connected to resources through the follow up services, the counter-cult ministry, and the family outreach services. This grant will help them continue to strengthen and expand its outreach ministries and services and help families witness to families.

Love Works! Lutheran Braille
Workers - \$5,000 Ninetyfive percent of blind and visually
impaired people are unchurched.
As the only LCMS ministry serving
people with visual impairments,
LBW offers unparalleled opportunity
to serve more than 300 million
severely visually impaired people
around the world. This \$5,000 grant
will be used for the production of
God's Word in Braille and Large
Print, enabling these people to
receive the message of salvation
through faith in Jesus Christ.

Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination

- \$15,000 Our LCMS will always need ordained pastors. Financial support is essential for educating men with God-given talents to be effective in their calling. Each time someone hears God's Word, they are benefiting from this project. We need to support these men who will be leading God's people in the truths of God's pure Word.

Scholarships for Full Time Church Work Students

- \$50,000 As our LCMS Synod grows and advances, we will always continue to need trained leaders and teachers. Scholarships are a way to help students going into full-time church work with the high cost of a college education.

Lutheranism 101 for Chinese Immigrants - \$7,500 The

fields are ripe for planting Gospel seeds among the 2 million Chinese immigrants in the United States (21,000 of whom live in Minnesota)! However, the language barrier can be a great obstacle when Chinese immigrants don't speak English very well, and LCMS pastors and evangelism teams don't speak Chinese. Lutheran churches and campus ministries in places like Duluth, Rochester, Iner Grove and Winona have requested Chinese translations specifically for outreach to teens, such as



God's Word for You, books for teaching confirmation class, such as Lutheranism 101, to introduce Chinese immigrants to the Savior. Lutheran Heritage Foundation will be able to translate and publish these materials with this grant.

Lutheran Island Camp's Christ Serve Academy - \$10,000 Christ Serve Ranch, a program of Lutheran Island Camp, has been providing Lutheran, Christian, Biblical worldview programming in science, leadership, outdoor education and the environment at its 275 acre science and environmental learning center. The Academy will take the best of its resources, research, instructors, and curricula and make them portable through on-line education, a science lending library, and onsite teaching with a mobile lab and classroom. The grant requested will be used to help fund staff training and the Christ Serve Academy during its first two years of operation.

Caring for Our Pastors - \$10,000
This grant would enable and encourage pastors of the Minnesota North to seek advanced training in the care of souls. It would reduce the current cost of attending by more than half, enabling even smaller congregations to send their pastors. This retreat training environment, called DOXOLOGY, grounded in Holy Scripture and the Lutheran Confessions, ensures that pastors will be emotionally and spiritually refreshed and equipped by their participation.

Crphanage in Yambio, South Sudan - \$15,000 This grant will be used to build a safe and secure home for the orphans of Yambio, South Sudan. This home will provide a center for learning about Jesus, their Savior. They will be equipped to become productive members of society. The land for the site of the orphanage has been purchased and structural details have been determined and are ready to be implemented when funds are obtained.

C.R.O.S.S. Appeal (Congregations Reaching Out to Support Schools) - \$14,000 In 2012 the Minnesota North District adopted a resolution that congregations and individuals in the district financially help support our seven Lutheran schools. Because Lutheran schools share God's Word daily, they are a blessing to many. The schools receiving these funds use the money in programs/activities which otherwise would not be possible. This grant would be distributed equally to the seven schools.

M Confessional Lutheran Education Foundation (CLEF) E-Reader Project - \$5,000

The funds requested for this project would be for a qualified professor that CLEF would send to an institution that needs to be introduced to the Kindle (electronic reader.) The professor teaches an introductory course using the Kindle and assisting the students in learning how to use the electronic reader. All subsequent courses are taught using the Kindle.

Puerto Rico Mission - \$3,000 In 2015 Rev. Matthew Ruesch was called to bring God's Word and Sacraments to the people living in Mayaguez.He has been serving the Prince of Peace Lutheran Church there but the congregation has not been able to fully support this outreach ministry. If this mission grant is adopted it will provide financial support to the Ruesch family and enable his ministry to continue at Prince of Peace and the surrounding community.

Bible Translation Field **Testing - \$10,000** In order to translate God's Word accurately, Lutheran Bible Translators have people that know Greek and Hebrew and can accurately translate God's Word into the unwritten languages still found in West Africa. It is equally important that the translated Scripture be clearly understood by the people it is being translated for and therefore it has to go through a process of review and testing The testing is done by local people reading it and then many of the indigenous people will have to hear it orally to give their input as that is how information is traditionally shared in this part of the world. This grant will enable this process to take place.

Seek support from your pastor and the church secretary. Share your goal to publicize LWML on a regular basis (monthly, quarterly, etc.) to inform LWML members and prospective members. Start small. There are bulletin bites available at (*lwml.org*) made just for this purpose.

Request a special place to post all LWML information on a bulletin board or kiosk. Post the LWML logo and a purple border around the area for posters, printed notices and service projects. Purple is our color and recognizable to all current and prospective LWML members.

Use the district and national mission grants as topics for your bulletins and posters. Information on these mission grants can be obtained from the LWML website, the *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly*, and the *Minnesota Northern Light* newsletter. And you can post notices for society meeting, zone rallies, workshops, district and national conventions, etc.

Involve LWML members, youth, the confirmation class and other interested church members to make LWML posters, banners and displays. Ask those people with special skills in scrapbooking, graphic arts, or computer savvy to help with your displays that promote LWML. They may want to join LWML if they see what FUN we have together.

For **needed supplies**, check your local craft stores or seek donations from church members. The LWML catalog has numerous resources that can be used in displays.

Don't forget about the wonderful Bible studies, program helps, and mission grant information available to you on the district and national websites. If you do not have a computer or need help in gaining computer skills, this would be a wonderful opportunity to develop a closer friendship with a young woman or family member in your quest for internet information.

May the Lord bless your PR efforts with new LWML members and informed current members. Increase your membership one woman at a time!


