A GATHERING OF SISTERS

This past November, four of us from LWML MN North attended the Assembly of Leaders Workshop in St. Louis. We are very excited to share what we have learned by conducting workshops throughout our district.

There are resources available to all of us who want to use our gifts and talents to serve God. Sometimes we just need a few helpful hints or suggestions. Here are some of the topics we will cover:

- A separate group formed especially for the purpose of supporting the object of the LWML and participating in LWML programs.
- Part of a women's group formed for another purpose (such as Bible study, social/fellowship, exercise, mother's club, etc.) but committed to the object of LWML.
- A women's ministry program organized according to a circle plan. A circle plan unites the women of the congregation in one general LWML group, with smaller groups (circles) working separately in their areas of interest (e.g. altar care, Bible study, missions, nursery, quilting, etc.). Groups using a circle plan usually have quarterly meetings which bring all the circles together for a special program.
- Members of two small churches, geographically close to one another, which unite to form one LWML group.

The groups should be tailored to the women involved, not making the women conform to the group.

To carry a program out effectively, most local groups have a chairman, a secretary, and a treasurer who have specific assigned duties.

For small groups in the early stages of LWML affiliation, a chairman or contact person (or mite collector) may be the only officer. This person's responsibilities include keeping members informed of, and encouraging participation in, LWML activities and submitting mite offerings to the designated LWML district financial officer.

Mission Grants Committee Report

A total amount of \$18,000 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$4,500 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination; \$4,500 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Student; \$5,000 for Lutheran Island Camp and Christ Serve Ranch Staff Growth and Training; \$4,000 for Trinity HOPE Haitian Feeding Program. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2018-2020 biennium.

Thank You from Trinity HOPE


Dear Members of MN North LWML District,

2019 is here! We hope and pray this new year brings you great joy and you have many opportunities to glorify God by serving others. You are certainly a tremendous blessing to the children in Haiti through the on-going sponsorship of your school, and we want to share our most sincere thanks.

Life in Haiti continues to be more and more challenging, and the unrest among the people seems to be growing. Since July 2018 there has been a noticeable increase in the number of protests and demonstrations throughout the country, with the fundamental cause seeming to stem from the frustration and concern the people have with their government leaders. At times these demonstrations have become violent and in some rare situations, have even led to death. In most cases, these demonstrations are pre-planned and the majority of people stay off the streets and remain safely in their homes. However, they also result in the children not being able to go to school on those days, and we have seen attendance dip some this year during those times.

Despite those challenges, the work Trinity HOPE is doing throughout Haiti continues to move forward, and God continues to bless the ministry beyond measure. At the beginning of this school year, we added six new schools to our feeding programs, representing an additional 172,000 meals each year. We are now serving 121 schools each day and providing well over 4,000,000 meals each year.

We give God all the glory for everything He has allowed us to accomplish! We also give God tremendous thanks for each of our school sponsors



and for allowing us to partner with you. The children at your school are so blessed by your generosity and support. To show you their appreciation, they have prepared the enclosed materials especially for you. We hope you will enjoy them and will continue to keep these beautiful children in your daily prayers.

Thank you for all you do, and may God bless you and fill your 2019 with His joy and peace!

Minnesota North District awards scholarships to full-time church work-students and to seminarians. This past year our scholarships totaled \$26,784.70. Deadline to apply for a scholarship will soon be upon us – May 15 the applications need to be in to the Scholarship Chairman.

To qualify, a student must be a member of an LCMS congregation in Minnesota North District and pursuing a degree in full-time church work at one of Concordia universities or preparing for ordination at one of the seminaries.

Full-time church work includes vocations such as Deaconess, Director of Christian Education, Director of Christian Outreach, Lutheran day school teacher, lay ministry, music ministry and others.

LCMS Concordia universities are located in; Ann Arbor, MI, Austin, TX, Bronxville, NY, Irvine, CA, Mequon, WI, Portland, OR, River Forest, IL, St Paul, MN, and Seward, NE.




