Does God get the glory?

Our mercy mission is to reflect the love of our Lord, Jesus Christ. As we do those acts of service or provide for people's needs with supplies or money, we open the opportunity for someone to ask, 'Why are you doing this?' If sharing the love of Jesus is our primary mission, we should be sending our money and gifts of the heart to organizations who are also working toward that goal. In LCMS President Matthew C. Harrison's article, From the President section in the March 2025 issue of The Lutheran Witness, he addresses RSO's (Recognized Service Organizations) of the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod. The LCMS.org website says, "RSO's agree to ensure their programs are in harmony with the doctrine and practice of LCMS."

How can we use that information in MN North? When we are asked to give or make, we can check to see if that organization is on the RSO list. If it is a local organization, we do the best we can to understand what that organization is doing in relation to the LCMS doctrine, especially in regarding life, marriage and families.

Reverend Matthew Harrison, in his article, specifically talks about Lutheran World Relief. "As the ELCA wandered away from the clear biblical teachings on sexual morality, this (LIRS)* and other intersections of the ELCA and the LCMS (such as Lutheran Disaster Response, institutional chaplaincy, military chaplaincy, Lutheran World Relief and so on) became ever more challenging." Lutheran World Relief has followed the ELCA. "Lutheran World Relief...became and remains a rebranded independent entity apart from the LCMS. ...It does charitable work as a government contractor. There is no specifically Christian content, no sharing of the blood of Jesus for the forgiveness of sins."

Since there is an RSO that does the same work plus more, it seems appropriate to make the change to send our quilts and kits to Orphan Grain Train. The gifts sent to Orphan Grain Train are delivered to LCMS churches. A specific example is from the articles after hurricane Helene about the Church in Asheville, North Carolina that received supplies from OGT and then distributed those supplies. Likewise, gifts to foreign destinations go to groups, organizations or churches that are connected to LCMS by doctrine.

Is that doctrinal connection important? It is. Just as in the apostle Paul's day when issues arose, his response was that Christians should not be "stumbling blocks" (1 Corinthians 8:9) to anyone. We want the message to be clear. These gifts are for you because of Jesus' love for us and for you. No other issues should get in the way of this and it's important that when that gift is received and the question (Why are you doing this?) is asked the answer can be clear. You are getting this gift because of the incredible gift our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ has given to us by dying for our sins!

Scholarships

Scholarships available through the LWML Minnesota North District are available to members of LCMS congregations attending or planning to attend one of the LCMS Concordia Universities or one of the two LCMS Seminaries with the intent of entering into full time church work within the Synod. Full time church work includes areas of service such as Deaconess, Church school teacher. Director of Christian Education, Director of Christian Outreach, Director of Parish Music, Director of Family Life Ministry, and much more. Also, men preparing for ordination at either Concordia Seminary, St. Louis or Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne, are eligible for scholarships through the LWML Minnesota North District.

Applicants for the scholarships must be preparing for full time church work in the LCMS, be a resident of the Minnesota North District, a member of a LCMS congregation, and be enrolled in an LCMS university or seminary to receive funding. Each applicant will need a written reference from their pastor and two other persons, along with a completed MN North District LWML scholarship application form. Applicants for the scholarships are also to submit an essay answering the questions, "Who is Jesus and how does He still come and care for you?" and "How do you think the LWML scholarship opportunity will continue in your life and career choices?" The scholarship application and other information can be found on the district website, lwmlmnn.org, click on Scholarships on the committee menu. The application deadline for scholarship consideration is May 15, 2025. No late submissions can be accepted.

LCMS universities include: Concordia University, Ann Arbor; Concordia University, Irvine; Concordia University Wisconsin; Concordia University, Chicago; Concordia University, St. Paul; and Concordia University, Seward. The eligible seminaries are Concordia Seminary, St. Louis and Concordia Theological Seminary, Fort Wayne.

The Scholarship Committee will meet after May 15, 2025, to review applications and to prepare recommendations for presentation to the LWML Minnesota North District Board of Directors.

Available funds for Scholarships totaling \$40,000 over the biennium were designated by the LWML Minnesota North District at its June 2024 convention. For the academic year 2025-2026, \$20,000 will be available for scholarship awards. The scholarship funding requests, along with other mission grants designated by the LWML MN North District, are funded through MITES.

Mission Grants Report

A total amount of \$22,975 in Mites for LWML MN North grants was available this past quarter. The Board of Directors approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: C.R.O.S.S. Appeal - \$4,425; DOXOLOGY - \$4,425; Physical Wellness for At Risk Children Dakota Ranch - \$2,425; St. Paul's Lutheran School, Perham - \$3,425; Immanuel Lutheran School, Walker - \$1,925; Good shepherd Lutheran School, Elk River - \$2,425; Swaddling Clothes, Redeemer, Aurora - \$3,925. Attributes of a Leader

Confidence in Christian leadership is being grounded in the Word, "And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near." (Hebrews 10:24–25)

No two groups of people have the same abilities because they are made up of unique individuals, each with their own set of Godgiven gifts. God has placed them together to achieve the plans that He has made for them. However, there are certain qualities that can be helpful in every effective leader:

- Listening to and learning from others in your group meaningful discussion that could turn a good idea into a plan of active service.
 "Whoever belittles his neighbor lacks sense, but a man of understanding remains silent." (Proverbs 11:12)..
- Encourage others to use their talents and help channel them to where they are most effective within the group. *"Therefore encourage one another and build one another up, just as you are doing."* (1 Thessalonians 5:11)
- An agreeable attitude will go a long way in keeping a discussion moving and finding a successful compromise when necessary. *"If* possible, so far as it depends on you, live peaceably with all." (Romans 12:18)
- Devote time to prayer. Pray for the guidance God has promised to send, listen for His instructions, and move forward expecting Him to be there with you. *"Continue steadfastly in prayer, being watchful in it with thanksgiving."* (Colossians 4:2)

Enthusiasm in your service to the Lord will set an energetic example for your group. When your energy is lagging, explain to your group what you are feeling and allow them to serve and support you. Don't rob them of an opportunity for service. *"[Do] the will of God from the heart, rendering service with a good will as to the Lord and not to man."* (Ephesians 6:6b-7)

- Rejoice in your role as leader. God has placed you in this position for a reason and He will not abandon you. He has planned your life down to the smallest detail and will walk with you every step of the way. *"Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you."* (1 Thessalonians 5:16–18)
- Pray for and develop as many of these qualities as possible within yourself. Look for other leaders in your group with strong leadership qualities different from your own; mentor them and let them lead with you. Together your group can *"serve the Lord with gladness."* (Psalm 100:2)

Making A Difference

Greetings LWML Sisters and Brothers in Christ. This past fall, I started working with St. Paul's Church & School in Perham as their Campaign Assistant. What a challenging and rewarding experience this has been!

As some of you may know, St. Paul's Church voted to begin a campaign to raise funding for building updates to the school and a new parking lot. The ultimate goal of the project is 4.5 million dollars, where as, the minimum goal is to raise 2 million dollars. The campaign is based on pledges, creative giving, and onetime gifts. The campaign is designed to continue through 2027.

The project will include replacing the portable classrooms, building a new music room, a breakout space, hallway around the gymnasium to address acoustic issues, repair of the existing gymnasium walls, installation of a sprinkler system, a new HVAC system, a parking lot update to address student safety, and a new more secure entry way.

Interestingly, fifty percent of the students that attend St. Paul's Lutheran School in Perham, are not members of St. Paul's. Of those, fourteen percent are unchurched families. The school has thirteen staff members and uses Pastor Ratcliffe and DCE Chris Brown. Each staff member plays a vital role in the ministry at St. Paul's.

What a true blessing it has been working with these individuals throughout the fall and winter months. The school and ministry at St. Paul's are truly a mission field and seeing the work that is done behind the scenes for the children is truly breath taking. Thank you to those who make the school in Perham possible, for not only my children to attend, but for the community. It does make a difference in the lives of others! On Saturday, February 8, LWML members and a few spouses, from Holy Cross Lutheran Church,

St. Cloud, met to make and decorate approximately 1,000 Valentine cookies thanks to funding from a Thrivent grant benefitting local emergency responders (police, state patrol, fire fighters, EMS, etc.). A few members also made cookies at home and donated them to the cause for an overall total approximating 1,400 cookies. Volunteers delivered the packaged cookies to the local facilities.
