THE IMPORTANCE OF BIBLE STUDY IN THE CHRISTIAN LIFE



Haiti Container Project Update

The truckers brought the 40 foot container to Bemidji June 4th to the place where all the items to be sent was gathered. The 4th was a beautiful day. An efficient crew from the Bemidji Circuit loaded all but the generator, which was delivered from Mankato on Wednesday the 6th. It was a rainy day, but it did not pour until right after the container door was closed. The container is now on the way to Haiti and should arrive in early July.

The Lutheran Mission Association and the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Haiti want to thank all the individuals, LWML groups and the churches in the Minnesota North District for the generous gifts of items and money to make it possible to help our sister church in Cap Haitian. The school, clinic, orphanage, sewing center and all the people involved from this endeavor. Wouldn't you love to be a fly on the door of that container when it is unloaded?

There were too many items to mention all of them. 55 boxes of medical supplies for the clinic, 73 boxes of school kits and supplies, 38 boxes of shoes, 79 boxes of women's clothing, 20 boxes of health kits, 37 boxes for sewing center, etc...

20 small school chairs were taped in pairs and bags of medicine bottles were put to fill the empty spaces in the chairs.

Thank you again to everyone that donated so generously. We will keep you updated on what is happening with this mission project. The Lutheran Mission Association is meeting in July to discuss any future plans.

PROMOTE YOUR LWML

Plan ahead for a successful LWML event.

- Select a publicity person or small committee whose main duty is to "get the word out."
- Create an eye-catching flyer announcing the date, time, and location of the event.
- Place the flyers in visible locations: church bulletin boards, classrooms, information center in your church, windshields of the vehicles in the church parking lot.
- Businesses throughout the community might display a flyer for you: grocery stores, convenience markets, barbershop, hairdressers, coffee shops, or restaurants.
- List the event in your local newspaper's calendar of events page or church section.
- Don't forget to announce the event in the church newsletter and bulletin.
- Create a poster or display for your bulletin board that will remind your members of the upcoming event.
- An announcement at the end of the worship service is effective, reminding people that the information can be found in the church newsletter or bulletin.
- For events scheduled around special holidays and seasons, get creative with special colors, textures and include photos from past events.

With a bit of planning and organization, your LWML events can be well attended and successful!

Lutheran Women Adopt Record \$1.7 Million Mission Goal!

How is that for a headline! It was one of the most exciting aspects of the National LWML Convention in Sioux Falls. It was truly an awesome experience to be able to attend.

As the district person in charge of the mite grants, I was especially thrilled at the 2005-2007 goal being met and exceeded by more than \$55,000. What a faithful God we have and as you can see by the headline we forge on with an ambitious new goal before us.

As the Minnesota North District we are a part of this great organization. 25% of the mites we gather goes towards this goal. The remaining 75% stays with us to accomplish our mission goal of \$130,000 for the 2006-2008 biennium.

MISSION GRANT - \$4,750 TRINITY/HOPE FEEDING CHILDREN IN HAITI

Trinity/Hope is an organization whose mission is to actively seek and be careful stewards of each dollar God provides so that the maximum students in the schools of the Lutheran Church in Haiti have a hot meal each day.

The average child in Haiti has 6 or 7 meals a week. This decreases their energy level. A hot lunch enables them to be better nourished, increases their attention span (before in reading programs the children often couldn't stay awake in class), enhances their ability to learn and be more receptive to the Word of the Lord.

The children in Lutheran Schools in Haiti benefit directly as they are fed a hot lunch daily and they are FED the Word of the Lord. They in turn witness to their families what God has done for them. In this land of Satan and voodoo teachings, the Lutheran churches and schools are bringing our Savior to the people so they will know the saving grace of Jesus Christ.



Introducing... S-U-Z-Y S-T-R-U-C-T-U-R-E

Suzy's purpose is much like that of an athletic team's mascot -- she brings enthusiasm, encouragement, and helpful information to all who are involved with the structure of an organization. Because Suzy



has the tools needed to build a strong structure for her LWML organization, she is confident and happy. The cross of Christ on her hard hat is a reminder that "everything should be done in a fitting and orderly way." (1 Cor. 14:40) RONR (Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised 10 th Edition) is the parliamentary authority which governs the proceedings of the LWML organizations at all levels, and the gavel is the tool used by a presiding officer to signal for attention or order.

Since Suzy is the new kid on the block, for her first visit she wishes to share some very basic structure information. What are bylaws?

The bylaws of a group are the rules that relate to it as an organization and prescribe how the group will function. What are standing rules?

Standing Rules are rules that are related to the administration of a group rather than parliamentary procedure.

Guidelines/Procedures Manual These are used to give the details of responsibilities and procedures. They help to keep the bylaws simple and concise.

Articles In A Set Of Bylaws

Most bylaws of LWML groups contain the following articles:

- *Name Committees
- *Object Mission Grants (mostly in district bylaws)
- *Members Finances
- Organization Fiscal Year
- Officers Dissolution
- Pastoral Counselor
- *Parliamentary Authority
- Meetings Amendments
- *Representation
- Executive Committee
- and/or Board of Directors

*These articles must conform with the LWML Bylaws.
