

#### Orphan Grain Train

#### About the Presentation:

Swaddling Clothes at Redeemer, Aurora, is a mission of mercy providing much needed items to families, many who are economically disadvantaged with much needed items to facilitate the nurture babies and infants. Items are provided free of charge to participants. The premise of Swaddling Clothes is two-fold: to show the love of Christ through acts of mercy; and to support the nurture of babies as an alternative to abortion. The demand for the services of Swaddling Clothes, supported by volunteers at Redeemer, has increased consistently since its inception.

#### About the presentation:

Lutheran Island Camp has been providing opportunities for outdoor ministry for 72 years and the LWML has always been an essential part of making that possible, beginning with the provision of funds to build the current chapel building during the 1953 LWML Convention. There are 72 years of stories of Camp changing lives and some of you in this room have some of those stories. A robust Power of Camp study has found that youth that attend summer camp are three-times as likely to be active in Christian community including campus ministry, Bible study, regular worship attendance and groups like LWML.
