Have you ever been so thirsty that your throat feels dry and scratchy? I would venture to say that most of us would reply, 'No', but have been close. How about waking up in the middle of the night and feeling thirsty after a salty evening meal? I'm sure many of us have experienced that. Finally, have you thirsted for just the right type of drink for the right occasion – a meal, a workout, a special occasion?

LWML Prayer Service for 2010

Isaiah 52:7 How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!"



The LWML Prayer Service for 2010 centers around "Beautiful Feet." The title was inspired by Isaiah 52:7; one of the two theme verses used at the Portland LWML Convention in June of 2009.

The Prayer Service will encourage the members of your society and congregation to:

- Worship God the Maker of all things.
- Trust in the Lord who daily meets your needs.
- Declare God's peace and provision through tangible acts of mercy and grace.
- Share the Good News of Jesus in everyday situations.

The service is divided into four parts: God's presence and forgiveness, the feet of those who brought me peace, those to whom my feet bring peace, and those to whom our feet bring peace. Parts 2-4 will require some preparation for those

leading the service. There are multiple song selections to choose from, advance preparation and meditation suggestions, and time for sharing during the service.

Make this Prayer Service a priority as you plan the christian life portion of your society's meetings. It can also be used as a congregational or Zone gathering or as a Lenten service.

Mission in Focus: VBS for Native American Children - White Earth Reservation by Nebraska Youth - \$4,000 grant.

The goal of this project is to plant seeds of faith in children and families of the White Earth Reservation. Many of the Nebraska youth involved in this vacation Bible school in the past are now students in full-time church work. This project provides for transportation, food, housing, and teaching materials for the youth's mission.

The Nebraska youth come to Minnesota for two different VBS locations for one week, one in the morning and one in the afternoon. They also come again at Christmas to distribute hats, mittens, scarves and quilts. Several of these young people have attended, and are attending, Concordia College, majoring in full-time church work programs. Mission in Focus: Medical Equipment for Haiti Clinic - \$10,000 grant.

The need for medical care and good health practices is vital in this poverty stricken area (Haiti is the poorest country in the western hemisphere). The clinic has one or two physicians, nurses, and a lab technician. Periodically, medical teams from the United States visit and practice in the clinic.

Due to the tropical climate, certain medical problems are prevalent and often go untreated. Electricity has been limited in availability in the past. As more energy becomes available, more equipment is needed to meet the needs of the patients.

This outreach into the community is an opportunity to share the love of Jesus Christ in a real and tangible manner.

Any age is the right age for church work

2000: Do you remember all the hype about changing centuries? Do you remember any names of LWML scholarship recipients of that time? (I don't either!) What matters is that our mites provided opportunity for several individuals to continue studying for full-time church worker careers. It's possible that some of them redirected their education efforts, but we know we assisted them in their Walk in the Light. Some of them may be enriching congregations within our District, while others took their "Minnesota Nice" to witness elsewhere in the world. (Since it's winter in Minnesota, maybe we should be honest and say they know our God is the same in a warmer climate -- so be ye transplanted!)

2010: MN North District applicants continue to share a willingness to explore the opportunities God is showing them within our Concordia education system. Our mite-y prayerful LWML support is just a part of God's Plan for each of them. Only He knows where He will lead them. Has that changed since 2000? No!

A new thought: Are you a person who was taking college courses in 2000? If you did not complete your degree, is it time for you to rethink your situation – particularly if you can visualize yourself as a full-time church worker! Are you part of an extended family that has someone considering the possibility of pursuing seminary study? Have you considered LWML scholarship assistance? There is no age requirement. If you considered these possibilities in 2000 you are just 10 years older! God is patient: Can we help you?

2020: Our world will be different, our Concordia schools and seminaries will be different, but God's Word will be the same. Who will go to preach, teach, organize, facilitate, encourage, guide and challenge our world? We, the LWML MN North, know that our mite-y mites will continue to support God's vocational nudging. New workers will enter the harvest fields; new workers of all ages. We don't need to know how our mites have blessed families or congregations within the MN North District, or just where in the world they continue to bless individuals and churches.

Now, today, each of us needs to pray for those of all ages considering what God is calling them to do. I noted in a comment on a recent application reference that, "God's still quiet voice is not silenced as He guides those He calls within church work vocations." Maybe the time wasn't right in 2000 when "full-time church work" crossed your mind. If 2009 still wasn't the right year, maybe 2010 is the time. Career options are not limited to what may be suggested on the scholarship application. Whatever your Concordia school offers as full-time church worker curriculum, is what we support. Applications can be downloaded from MN North Web Site. Deadline for all assistance is May 15. If you will not be entering school in the Fall of 2010, you may still be eligible for second semester assistance, but you need to complete the application, including an essay and references before May 15.

Nominations are needed for Financial Secretary, and Regional Vice Presidents for Arrowhead II, Lakeland II and Park II.

Growing in Christ

At the LWML National Convention in Portland in June 2009, we were presented with three Primary Targets for the 2009-2011 biennium. Here are some thoughts on how they can be useful in your life.

Growing in the Lord - *Through intentional study* of the Word, women of today find guidance for their lives and are encouraged in their personal daily walk with the Lord.

Are you currently in a Bible study? If not, why not? Perhaps you feel there isn't enough time. It's interesting that we make time for sports, hobbies, and travel, but finding time for Bible study is difficult. Try starting an online Bible study with other women your age; or try finding a time to meet with others once a week for an hour. Another idea is to take your *Lutheran Woman's Quarterly* magazine and Bible along for those times when you have to run your children to their practices; or you could listen to the Bible on your I-pod or MP3 player.

All of your life, and how you live it, rests entirely on what Jesus has done for you. Listen to what He has to tell you!

Embracing Our Diversity - The body of Christ grows and is strengthened when sisters of every age, class, culture, and ethnic group are sought out to participate actively in the mission of the LWML.

This Primary Target talks not only of different ethnic groups, but also sisters of every age. Sisters of every age are all around you. There are many older women in your societies and congregations. Rather than seeing these women in an adversarial light, embrace the differences you have. What can you learn from them? How has their growing up experience been different than yours? In a few years, you will be one of them. Start now to think about what kind of an older woman you want to be. Will younger women look up to you as a mentor? Will they be able to see Jesus in you?

Sharing the Heart and Identity of LWML -LWML enables and equips its member and advocates to share with others the vision and direction of LWML as it emphasizes mission outreach locally and globally.

Over the years some of our Societies combined LWML and Ladies Aid groups. Sadly, sometimes LWML has gotten pushed aside in some of our societies. I challenge you to look at the mission statement of the LWML: "The mission of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League is to assist each woman of the Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod in affirming her relationship with the Triune God so that she is enabled to use her gifts in ministry to the people of the world." Is your local society living out this mission statement? Are you living out this mission statement? If not, you be the catalyst for change right where you are.

Come, join us at convention! Be strengthened by being in the Word, and spending time with your sisters in Christ. Let us worship Him together and give Him all the glory as we choose a new mission goal and projects!



Structure

Here is some guidance on structure from other LWML Districts:

<u>Oregon District:</u> The Structure Committee exists to help societies develop organizational structures capable of fulfilling their unique ministries; and to maintain the district bylaws and standing rules.

<u>Missouri District:</u> Purpose - The purpose of the Structure Committee is to provide a flexible, viable tool for better function of the organization.

<u>Texas District:</u> Write flexible bylaws. Be brief; use bare-bones bylaws. Use standing rules for items that may need frequent changing, such as meeting information, ad-hoc committees, convention expenses for delegates, etc.

- Send proposed revisions to the District Structure Committee for approval prior to adoption. After adoption, send a final copy for the district file.
- If you change your society name, you need to write new bylaws.
- Articles on object, membership and parliamentary authority <u>must</u> conform to *national* bylaws.

<u>English District:</u> The bylaws should not contain trivial matters or temporary provisions. They are meant to provide the most basic regulations, understandable by the typical member. Review bylaws each biennium, and make sure they reflect changes made at the national level of the organization.

Improving Our Listening Skills

Why listen?

Listening is a courtesy. Listening gives others a needed boost. Listening is what gives meaning to speaking. Listening gives us a background for decision-making. Listening can change knowledge into wisdom.

Presenting the problem:

Listening is a skill, like speaking, reading and writing. How much time did we spend in school learning each of these skills? We were told to listen, but were we taught how to listen?

What does our brain do when it listens to someone talking? It tunes in and out. If the "out" is a split second, we do not lose any words, but quite often, we are distracted too long and we miss the completion of an idea. Having lost the "thread" makes it harder to follow, and our attention degenerates.

Exploring the problem:

"I just wasn't interested in the subject."

- "I do not agree with the speaker."
- "I was thinking of what I was going to say."

"I listen only to what I want to hear."

Being a patient listener demands much selfdiscipline.
