Servant? or Leader?

As I was looking through my LWML keepsakes, I came across an outline from the Assembly of Leaders event in St. Louis, MO, in 2008 with the heading "A Time To Lead". The following information is taken from that outline (**highlighted in bold print**); my interpretation and notes are in regular print.

The Mission Statement of the

LWML

Lutheran Women's Missionary League is to assist each woman of The Lutheran Church — Missouri Synod in affirming her relationship with the Triune God so that she is enabled to use her gifts in ministry to the people of the world.

Building Up Our Sisters in Christ—We LWML members grow and mature through mentoring, training, and support from current leaders. Do you mentor? Have you encouraged anyone? Have you been a servant to others?

Let's look at what was said about a leader being a servant...

In 2 Timothy 2: 22-26, the qualities of a servant are listed; *"faith, love, and peace,"* and *"the Lord's servant must not be quarrelsome but kind to everyone, able to teach, patiently enduring evil, correcting his opponents with gentleness..."*

Servant? We are talking about a leader, aren't we? Jesus was a perfect servant. He served by giving His life as a ransom for many. Jesus received the wages for our sins of not following His leadership as we should. We do have God's forgiveness for the times we don't follow Him. We have the Gospel which is the GOOD NEWS.

In I Thessalonians 2: 6-8, the qualities of a servant are again addressed: "Nor did we seek glory from people, whether from you or others, though we could have made demands as apostles of Christ. But we were gentle among you, like a nursing mother taking care of her own children... we were ready to share with you not only the gospel of God but also our own selves, because you had become very dear to us."

You are God's servant! SERVANTHOOD is all inclusive—it involves the sum total of our living.

LEADERSHIP is but one aspect of this total commitment. Approaching servanthood/leadership from this perspective, consider the directive of our Lord: "Do not be slothful in zeal, be fervent in spirit, serve the Lord." Romans 12:11 or as I would paraphrase: Be not lazy in zeal, be burning in the Spirit, serving the Lord.

Mission Grants in Review

Grant # 3 - Orphan Grain Train \$8,500

What a wonderful time of year to reflect on all the blessings the Lord has showered us with and how we can share His goodness and love!

One of the grants adopted at the 2014 District Convention was Orphan Grain Train. This organization makes it possible to give humanitarian aid—both spiritual and physical to people worldwide.

While collecting numerous items (tons) of clothing, food and written Christian material, it is also imperative that we provide monetary means to transport these items to the people who need them—whether in our country or the far reaches of the world.

Our grant of \$8,500 will help Orphan Grain Train with the cost of shipping these items. May God be glorified through this mission of reaching others.

Mission Grants Committee Report

A total of \$22,600 was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$7,600 for Scholarships for Full-time Church Work Students; \$15,000 for School Building for Gloria Dei in Cap Haitian, Haiti. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2014-2016 biennium.

Layette kits include:

Diaper(s) • Baby wipes • Pacifier - new • Bottle - new • Sleeper • Onesie (1-piece underwear) • Receiving Blanket • Blanket No baby powders or lotions can be in the layette kit (due to Customs restrictions). Clothing & blankets can be new or gently used. Secure all items together; whether it's rolled like a hygiene kit, placed in a zip-lock bag, or placed in a small cloth bag

What goes into a School Kit? backpack • 2-3 spiral notebooks - any size • 2 or more pencils • 2 or more pens • pkg. of construction paper • crayons • ruler • glue sticks • blunt scissor • washable markers • protractor

What's in a Health (Hygiene) Kit?

1 bath towel • 1 wash cloth • 1 bath-size bar of soap • 1 adult-size toothbrush • 1 sturdy comb • 1 stick deodorant (optional) • 6 Band-Aids (1/2" or 3/4") secured together

<u>Wrapping Instructions</u>: Spread the towel flat; fold over about 5" on each, long side of the towel; Place everything in the center between the folds; Roll up the towel; Use strong ribbon or cord and tie at both ends; Linens should be in good condition and dark colors are recommended. Content items must be new, can be any brand, and are wrapped in the washcloth.

Are you in the process of reviewing your Zone or Society bylaws? Below is the recommended format (since Peoria Convention 2011) for Article I Name. (This is comes as a change from information shared in the previous newsletter.)

The name of this organization is Lutheran Women's Missionary League Minnesota North District (hereinafter referred as District) name of Region name of Zone name of Society which usually includes the name of the church (hereinafter referred to as), legal name of church, (city and/or township, state) a subordinate organization of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League (hereinafter referred to as LWML) as an auxiliary of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (hereinafter referred to as LCMS).

Please take note:

There are no commas until after the name of the Zone or Society (depending on which bylaws are being written).

This is the information that is under the name in the bylaws and at the bank.

The bank needs an EIN number. This can be the congregation or the LWML number. Do not include this number in the bylaws or on check blanks, but do have it in the treasurer's information.

WHO IS AN LWML WOMAN?

She is a member of a congregation of The Lutheran Church— Missouri Synod. She is a member of the Lutheran Women's Missionary League. She attends worship services faithfully. She attends church and LWML functions as often as possible. She is a mother, grandmother, aunt, sister, daughter, and a baptized child of God.

WHAT MIGHT AN LWML WOMAN DO?

She prays daily. She helps to make quilts by serving, tying, and/or donating supplies for others to make quilts. She puts her change into the Mite box and

includes a prayer for mission grants—both on the district and national level. She assists with fellowship hour by baking, serving, and/or cleaning up the kitchen. She attends Bible study and may sometimes lead the group. She helps with the food bank. She cooks and serves at Advent and Lenten meals at her Church. She makes bandages to send to the missions in Africa. Most of all—she uses her gifts to God's glory and "Serves the Lord with Gladness".

Sharing Encouragement with Young Women

Women value the friendship, support, and encouragement from other women. We all need to strive to offer warm, welcoming opportunities for women to grow in faith and relationships as sisters in Christ. In what ways can we do this for young women?

Be prayerful. Pray for guidance in befriending young women. Sincere interest and concern for their situations will provide a foundation for a wonderful friendship. Talk to the young women in your congregation and get to know them. Many women do not feel comfortable attending a Bible study for the first time if they don't know someone there personally.

Be inviting. Personally invite the young women to all of your LWML events and service projects. Many young women will make time to attend the events if they are personally invited. Assume every woman wants to be involved without assuming they are too busy. Sometimes women are just waiting to be asked.

Be persistent. Even though you have asked the young woman to attend several meetings and she hasn't attended, ask again. If you don't ask and she was able to attend, she might not attend because she wasn't asked this time.

Be helpful. Ask if there is anything that would make it easier for the young woman to attend the meeting and attempt to provide this. Maybe a ride to the meeting or babysitting services would be helpful.

Be flexible. The meeting location and time doesn't have to be the same as it has always been just because that is the way it has always been done. Maybe changing to an hour earlier or later would help, or maybe having it at the church instead of at women's homes would work better. Sometimes, a group may need to offer two times for Bible study; one during the daytime for those who don't want to go out at night and one in the evening for those who can't attend during the day.

Be informative. Young women may not know what the LWML is all about. Be ready to explain the benefits of the LWML. Provide details regarding what occurs at the meeting you are inviting the young woman to.

Be humble. If there is anything you need that the young woman could provide, ask them. We are all young women and we all want to help. Being needed is often the catalyst for young women to attend meetings and participate in LWML activities.

Be trusting. God is in charge and worry does not add even a minute to your life; therefore trust that God will work through you to befriend young women. Remember, it is not about the numbers, but it is about the relationships with those young women.

What full-time church work profession must a student be pursuing in order to qualify for this scholarship? To name some: Lutheran Day School teacher, Deaconess, Director of Christian Education, Director of Christian Outreach, Director of Family Life Ministry, Director of Parish Music.

To be eligible for an LWML MN North scholarship a student must be a member of an LCMS church in the Minnesota North District. He or she must be enrolled or planning enrollment in one of the ten schools in the Concordia University system.
