Grants for foreign missions must be cleared through the LCMS Office of International Mission before they can be presented to our Mission Grant Committee for consideration. (Several years ago, a worthy grant proposal was denied as it had not gone through this process.)

What has God placed on your heart that needs funding to bless others in special ways?

What else can you do? Be generous with your mite offerings so that all of our mission grants can be funded for this biennium. We are well on our way towards our goal, but still need your continuous support and prayers.

MISSION GRANT REPORT

A total amount of \$26,000 in mites for LWML MN North grants was raised this past quarter. The Mission Grant Committee recommended and the BOD approved the payment of grant allocations as follows: \$5,000 for Scholarships for Men Preparing for Ordination; \$14,500 for Scholarships for Full-Time Church Work Students; \$3,000 for Trinity HOPE Haitian Feeding Program; \$3,500 for "Main Street Living North" Ministry Outreach TV Program. The chart below details the current balance remaining for the 2018-2020 biennium.
